Charitable work earns accolades for Richmondites

A Richmond man will climb stairs to support lung health.

Chris Lam's inaugural climb of the steps outside the Sheraton Vancouver Wall Centre Hotel in Vancouver is in support of the British Columbia Lung Association's 6th Annual Climb The Wall: The Stairclimb For Clean Air taking place Sunday, Feb. 18.

Inspired by a personal mission of clean air and lung health, Lam will test his leg and lung muscles against the tallest staircase in B.C.

A Richmond engineer has been honoured for giving his time as a volunteer with the Tetra Society of North America.

Jay Drew, who owns United Lock-Block Ltd., recently received a Governor General's Caring Canadian Award at a ceremony in Victoria. It recognized the long-time volunteer work he does inventing custom devices to aid people with disabilities for the non-profit society dedicated to creating inventions that enable people with disabilities to overcome barriers. Drew has more than 200 inventions to his name.

Some business-savvy Richmond students competed in a provincewide business challenge.
